



A cautious welcome for FAQ vote on Lord Burns reform package

Speaking on the Football Association's decision to pass a number of resolutions to streamline the association's decision-making process, Michael Brader said, "I believe it was pretty much universally accepted that the FA's decision making process had been effectively deadlocked for years and that the proposal for a new independent Chairman and a vote for the Chief Executive should break through that deadlock.

In addition, with the FA Council being widened to be more representative of the game and its interests, it is hoped that a more modern and accountable structure will prevail."
